

**VETERANS MEMORIAL ISLAND SANCTUARY  
ADVISORY COMMITTEE MINUTES  
Wednesday, November 2, 2016 – 10:00 a.m.  
Council Chambers, City Hall, Vero Beach, Florida**

**1. CALL TO ORDER**

Today's meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Committee members and the audience joined together in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

**3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

**A) September 7, 2016**

**Mr. Herman made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 7, 2016 Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary Advisory Committee meeting. Ms. Loy seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.**

**4. PUBLIC COMMENT**

**5. NEW BUSINESS**

**A. Ribbon Palm Tree Substitution Plan – Mr. Don Dexter, Public Works Manager**

Mr. Young reported that some of the Queen Palm trees are suffering from a disease, so they are replacing them with Ribbon Palms, which have a natural immunity to the virus.

Mr. Herman asked if they are only replacing one (1) or two (2) Queen Palms.

Mr. Young explained that there are about a half dozen on either side of the walkway leading to the cenotaph area that will be replaced.

Mr. Don Dexter, Public Works Manager, stated that the hurricane put a wrench in their timing for the tree replacement, but they are currently getting pricing from three (3) vendors.

Mr. Herman asked how many trees were affected by the disease.

Mr. Dexter replied that they are going to replace the 12 Queen Palms along the walkway between the flagpole and the ceremonial circle. Only one (1) Queen Palm completely died and some others look

questionable. The disease will continue to spread and that is why they are replacing all of them. They thought this would be a good opportunity to use some of the funds in the Tree Mitigation Account to plant some nicer Palms and spruce up the Island. As far as they know the Ribbon Palms are not susceptible to the fungus.

**B. Post Hurricane Recovery – Mr. Don Dexter, Public Works Manager**

Mr. Young commented that the only damage he saw on Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary following the hurricane was some foliage on the ground and the directory sign was ajar. The flag was taken down so it was not damaged.

Mr. Dexter stated that there was very minimal damage to the Island other than some branches being broken off the Banyan tree.

**C. Dedicatory Bench Request**

Mr. Young reported that the dedicatory bench request was removed from today's agenda.

**6. OLD BUSINESS**

**A. Veterans Day 2016 Planning – Mr. Tony Young**

Mr. Matthews showed a draft copy of the program for the Veterans Day ceremony. The cover is a picture of an American Bald Eagle that was provided by the National Veterans Day Committee. The keynote speaker is Army Major General Buckingham who is a recipient of the Silver Star, Bronze Star, and the Purple Heart. He briefly reviewed the schedule of events for the Veterans Day ceremony. He stated that the ceremony starts at 9:00 a.m., but people should try to get there early.

Ms. Loy stated General Buckingham is really honored to be the speaker and he is making an extra effort to be here, because he lives in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Young commented that General Buckingham has written several papers and some of them have become a standard for some of the war colleges. His experiences are still continuing to shape military officers today.

Mr. Young said that the community continues to help with the events on Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary. He stated that Home Depot called and offered to donate red, white, and blue flowers again for the Veterans Day ceremony and Quail Valley is providing a golf cart.

**B. Recap of POW/MIA Ceremony – Mr. Tony Young**

Mr. Young reported that there was a POW/MIA ceremony at the Indian River Mall. This was the first military ceremony ever held at the Mall.

**C. Report on Community Service Project by Saint Edward's School – Mr. Rob Slezak, Recreation Director**

Mr. Rob Slezak, Recreation Director, stated that they were fortunate to have Father Tommy Matthews and the students from Saint Edwards Upper School come out to Riverside Park and Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary for a community service project. They had more than 60

students who volunteered to cleanup Memorial Island and Riverside Park on September 13, 2016. They did a tremendous job of eliminating a lot of invasive vegetation and they scrubbed the benches and monuments. Home Depot provided all of the supplies for this project, which was a big help. The School plans on doing a community service project like this on a yearly basis.

Mr. Young asked Mr. Slezak for the name of the individual who coordinated this project so that he can send a thank you note.

Mr. Slezak replied that he will get that information to him.

## **7. CHAIRMAN'S MATTERS**

### **A. Recap of Gold Star Memorial Dedication – September 25, 2016**

Mr. Young reported that on September 25, 2016 there was a dedication of the Gold Star Memorial Monument in Port St. Lucie. He understands that this monument is one (1) of only two (2) in the State of Florida. The other monument is located in Tampa. Military families have a huge weight that they carry, so having a monument set aside for the families that have lost loved ones is enormous. There were at least a dozen Gold Star families who spoke at the dedication. The fact that we have our own Island here in Indian River County that recognizes the loss of men and women in service to our County is something they should be proud of.

Mr. Matthews commented that it was sad but sweet to hear the stories of the Gold Star families. It was a nice program with over 1,000 people in attendance.

### **B. A Wreath for Veterans**

Mr. Young stated that he was contacted by the Vietnam Veterans of American who are planning on displaying a wreath to honor the Vietnam Veterans on Veterans Day.

## **8. MEMBER'S MATTERS**

Mr. Matthews reminded the community and the Committee that the Marine Corp Ball will be on November 12, 2016 at Point West. It is almost sold out, but people can call him at 234-1512 and pick up tickets at his jewelry store. He said that he invited a gentleman to today's meeting to share an idea he has.

Mr. Doug Clock, United States Air Force Veteran, said that he is involved in the community and with the Boy Scouts. He brings the Boy Scouts to Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary to hand out water and programs during the ceremonies. He explained that during the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade in Sebastian he ran into a gentleman who was with an organization called Wreaths Across America. They are a nonprofit organization run by veterans that lay wreaths at the Arlington Cemetery and other cemeteries across the country and abroad. He said that Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary is one of the locations they are looking at to provide wreathes for. To start with, Wreaths Across America will give the City seven (7) free wreathes to be placed out on December 17<sup>th</sup>, which is the National Day for laying out the wreaths. His thought is that they could get the word out to the community and do fundraising, so they can get enough wreathes for all the cenotaph markers. He explained that each wreath costs \$15.00 and donations can even be made on line, which would go to the contact person for this county.

Mr. Matthews explained that they cannot make money for the Island, so the Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary Advisory Committee members cannot be the contact person for the program. He understands it is a nonprofit organization, but it would be fitting for a Veterans Organization to take it on as a project and raise the money over the course of the year.

Mr. Young agreed that this should be something that a Veterans Organization should look at. He said they can take this to the Veterans Council Executive Board to let them discuss it. He feels that if they do this all the cenotaphs should receive a wreath.

Mr. Matthews asked if someone donated \$1,500.00 could they authorize the wreaths be placed on all of the cenotaphs.

Mr. Young said he would hope that they would have an endorsement by a Veterans group. However, if a private business would like to support the project through the Veterans Council that is another way to handle it.

Ms. Loy stated that the concept is wonderful, but the details need to be worked out.

Ms. Fallon said that any non-profit organization could make a donation.

Mr. Matthews asked how long do the wreaths stay there and does the organization pick them back up.

Mr. Clock explained that they are fresh wreaths that might either be delivered by a truck, or shipped to the point of contact person. They can be displayed for as long as they want and then the organization or the Boy Scouts can pick them up.

Mr. Young said that from a timing perspective this is something that should be put in place next spring or summer.

Mr. Herman asked if they could accept the seven (7) wreaths and place them on the service markers on the Island for this year.

Mr. Young said that the seven (7) free wreaths are given with their commitment to participate in the program, so he would not accept them until they have everything in line.

Mr. Young said that he would like to congratulate Colonel Sam Coons on being elected as the new President of the Veterans Council of Indian River County. He also recognized the new 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President, Craig Waskow.

Mr. Matthews announced that on November 17, 2016 the Navy League will be honoring the Marine Corp birthday and Marine Colonel B.G. Hughes will be the speaker at the dinner. He said the Navy League has one of the best speaker series in the area.

Mr. Joe Coreccia and Mr. Garry Halstead, Indian River Charitable Association, announced that every year their organization sells tee signs for their annual golf tournament. For the past five (5) years they have been lining the roadway to Veterans Memorial Island Sanctuary on Veterans Day with the signs. This allows them to further recognize the local businesses who are investing in the veterans and the Charitable Association. This year they split the golf tournament with the Vietnam Veterans of Indian River County, which was a very successful tournament with 104 players.

Mr. Young asked how much money did they raise for the veterans.

Mr. Coreccia replied that they will have the final tally in the next few days. In the past they have usually issued them a check for \$1,000.00, but this year it might be \$3,000.00 or more.

Mr. Young asked how many signs will be placed along the road.

Mr. Coreccia stated that they sold about 35 to 40 sponsor signs and they are all from small businesses in Indian River County.

Mr. Young asked Mr. Coreccia if he could provide him with the names of businesses.

Mr. Coreccia replied yes.

Mr. Young stated that it is a priority to have the signs displayed very early.

Mr. Coreccia reassured him that the signs will be put out at 7:30 a.m. and right after the ceremony they will be picked up.

Mr. Young announced that there will be another Veterans Day ceremony at Sebastian's Riverview Park on November 11<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m. Also on November 11<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in Fort Pierce, Jetson TV & Appliance will hold their annual veterans recognition with a free hot dog barbeque. On Saturday November 12<sup>th</sup> Velde Ford is holding a fundraiser for veterans starting at 11:00 a.m.
